

PROTECTING OUR CHILDREN

Many persons seem to think that protecting children relates specifically to their physical well being—that is keeping them from physical harm and danger. However, protection of children goes far beyond the physical realm. We need to protect our children's mental development. Exposing children to written and visual images for which they are not ready for harms them mentally. Some of these include violent movies and cartoons, calendars with half-naked women, posters promoting x-rated parties, and the list could go on and on. This places pressure on the children and push them to grow up too fast. This is forcing the children to cope with adult information in the media before they have mastered the problems of childhood.

Psychologists, such as Isenberg (1980) indicate that this type of mental abuse of our children leads to aggressive behaviour in the short-term and lead children to become de-sensitized to violence later in life. This also discourages children from cooperating to resolve problems because they come to accept what they see as appropriate behaviour.

Let us truly protect our children by monitoring the things they view and aim to create balance in their lives by ensuring that the home and school environment provide their minds with healthy images.
