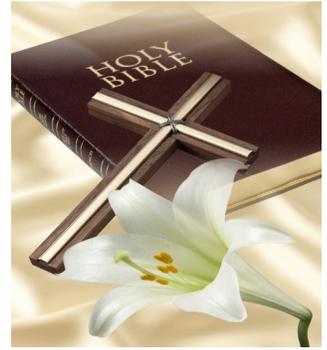

The following is an edited version of a message from the Baptist World Alliance General Secretary Neville Callam


Pentecost marks the season of the Spirit. As at the first Pentecost, the Spirit blows and the result is a remarkable empowerment. The weak are made strong, the timid made brave and those who fall silent in the face of perceived threat to their personal safety now burst the bonds of concern for self and bear potent witness to unvarnished, life-transforming truth. Filled with the Spirit, the disciples escape the grip of fear and timidity and speak a word in the name of Christ calling all who would listen to the new life God makes available to all who repent and believe the Gospel. Holy Spirit-inspired courage is badly needed in our world today. Pentecost summons us to rise up and speak courageously, to recognize that it is only in the power of the Spirit that we can speak truth to power, bear witness to the convictions we have been led to hold and to live authentically as people whom God is constantly renewing. Pentecost calls us to be people of real courage, not because of who we are, but because of who possesses us. Let us not forget, however, that when the Holy Spirit empowers us to act courageously, some may feel threatened by the prospect of losing their position of privilege. This may cost us dearly. Yet, what price can we not pay to live as God's Pentecostal people?

Our lives in the Spirit

In light of Christ's life in the Spirit, we can now ask what our daily life in the Spirit looks like. It is a Christoform life, one shaped after Christ's life. For the same Spirit whom Christ bears, Christ has also given to us.

Jesus is anointed with the Spirit at His baptism so that we, too, might receive His Spirit or anointing in our baptism.

Anointed to serve others

The Spirit anoints us to proclaim the Word. As the Father sends the Son and gives Him the Spirit to speak words that are "Spirit and life," so also does the Son breathe the Spirit on us, His disciples so that we might speak words that bring people to faith in Christ.
