

EDITORIAL: TRINITY

The first Sunday after Pentecost is celebrated as Trinity Sunday. On this day, Christians rejoice with thanksgiving in what the Father, Son and Holy Spirit have done to accomplish the mission of salvation for humanity. We remember the Father as our Creator, the Son as our Saviour and the Holy Spirit as our comforter. Yet even as we rejoice, we remain mystified by the three in one Godhead.

I tried to find an analogy to help in explaining the triune God but nothing could capture an explanation—they all related to things that have three distinctive parts, which did not capture the essence of the Trinity. God has no parts. The father, Son and Spirit are not parts of God, rather, each is fully and completely God, yet there is only one God. The truth is that the nature of the Trinity is something outside of our human experience or understanding. How the Lord can be one God in three distinct persons is not for us to debate. By the power of the Holy Spirit, we Christians accept this mystery and use this as a basis for extension of our faith in Almighty God.

Located at 82 Stennett Street, the J's Heart Ease Day Care and Pre-school Centre started in January 1992 with one child. The centre was opened to the public on September 4, 1992 with four children. Today, the centre has over 70 children on roll. The motto of the centre is "We cater for the whole child, so put your heart at ease" Embedded in this motto, J's Heart Ease offers love to all the children, promotes good habits and ensures that no child is abused. In this regard, the centre has regular parenting sessions to both inform and warn parents. The teachers, although certified NCTVET graduates, are also required to participate in these seminars. The centre follows the Early Childhood Curriculum as stipulated by the Ministry of Education which seeks to promote mental, social, physical and emotional development in child. In addition, J's Heart Ease provides enrichment programmes for the children by exposing them to different aspects of life outside of the daycare setting; thus children are taken on field trips (e.g. children's expo, hope gardens, beach) and engage in other educational tours. Also, J's Heart Ease seeks to promote sensitivity to Jamaican culture as well as knowledge of spiritual matters and as such truly caters to the whole child.

Facts you might be interested in

The lists of hurricane names have been generated by the National Hurricane Center since 1953. At first, the lists consisted of only female names; however, since 1979, the lists alternate between male and female. Hurricanes are named alphabetically from the list in chronological order. Thus the first tropical storm or hurricane of the year has a name that begins with "A" and the second is given the name that begins with "B." The lists contain names that begin from A to W, but exclude names that begin with a "Q" or "U." There are six lists that continue to rotate. The lists only change when there is a hurricane that is so devastating, the name is retired.

PEER PRESSURE

Peer pressure takes place when you do something that you don't want to do, but you do it because of force by friends/peers. Some young people give in to peer pressure because they want to feel a sense of belonging—they want to fit into the crowd. Some persons give in because of lack of self-confidence i.e. they do not believe in themselves to do things on their own. One other reason why people give in is the fear of embarrassment. For example, if a young person says no to smoking cigarette or engaging in sexual activities or stealing, then his/her peers will laugh at them and then begin to spread rumours about that person being "soft". Young people are afraid of being laughed at so instead of saying no, they bow to peer pressure.

We want to encourage our youths to believe in yourself but they can only do this if we as adults (parents, teachers) affirm them and believe in them. Let's show youths some love nuh!!
