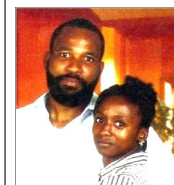

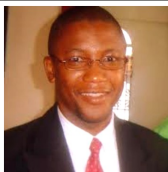
## Family Feature month

### LUKE SHAW:

#### Emmanuel - A Family away from home

On the 22<sup>nd</sup> September 1975 at the age of nine I came to Jamaica for the first time leaving my parents in Belize. My sister Marjorie the eldest of my siblings had come to Jamaica before and was working as a teacher in Galina, St. Mary. I and two other sisters, just a few years older than me, lived with her. She attended the Emmanuel Baptist Church and we joined her. Emmanuel became a family away from home for us. The Emmanuel Baptist Church family impacted my life greatly. The fellowship and ministry there played a significant role in my spiritual growth and formation as well as in the call of God upon my life to serve in the pastoral ministry. I never felt that I did not belong in the church family. The memories of the fellowship shared, guidance and care offered and opportunities to serve and grow in Christ will never be forgotten. It was a blessing to have experienced the pastoral guidance of Revds. Heckford Sharpe, Harry Jarrett and Joseph Anderson along with their families. They all made me feel special along with my Sunday school teachers and deacons.

### SINGLE VS MARRIED

The question of a Christian staying single and what the Bible says about believers never marrying is often misunderstood. Paul tells us in 1 Corinthians 7: 7-8: *"I wish that all men were as I am. But each man has his own gift from God; one has this gift, another has that. Now to the unmarried and the widows I say: It is good for them to stay unmarried, as I am."* Notice that he says

some have the gift of singleness and some the gift of marriage. Although it seems that nearly everyone marries, it is not necessarily God's will for everyone. Paul, for example, did not have to worry about the extra problems and stresses that come with marriage and/or family. He devoted his entire life to spreading the Word of God. He would not have been such a useful messenger if he had been married.

On the other hand, some persons are called to be married and they do better as a team, serving God as a couple and a family. Both kinds of people are equally important. It is not a sin to remain single nor is it a crime to get married. The most important thing in life is serving God.
