## GLESTER HYLTON:

I attended the Emmanuel Baptist church during the late 1970's into the 1980's. At Emmanuel, I enjoyed attending Youth Fellowship and singing with the Youth Choir. Also, I enjoyed going to the youth camps. The services that I really enjoyed were the Youth Sundays because the youths were in charge and got an opportunity to present their. I also really liked the Fathers' Day Sunday Services.

I stopped attending Emmanuel because I went to work in Kingston. I stayed in Kingston until the 1990's. When I returned to St. Mary I visited Emmanuel about two times but I have no particular reason why I have not returned. The persons who have had a significant impact on my life while at Emmanuel are Mrs. Plummer and Mrs. V. Irvin.

### WE ARE A PRIVILEGED PEOPLE

*A 15-year prison sentence was given to a woman and her seven children by an Egyptian court for converting to Christianity. A criminal court in the central Egyptian city of Beni Suef meted out the shocking sentence. Nadia Mohamed Ali, who was raised a Christian, converted to Islam when she married Mohamed Abdel-Wahhab Mustafa, a Muslim, 23 years ago. He later died, and his widow planned to convert her family back to Christianity in order to obtain an inheritance from her family. She sought the help of others in the registration office to process new identity cards between 2004 and 2006. When the conversion came to light under the new regime, Nadia, her children and even the clerks who processed the identity cards were all sentenced to prison.*

We are a privileged people - we can embrace Christianity without fear of being locked up!!
