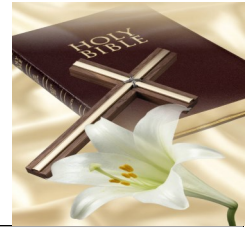



The day of Pentecost was one of the most important days in world history! When the Holy Spirit came upon the apostles and the other believers on the Day of Pentecost, those who heard them speaking in tongues were perplexed and asked, "What does this mean?" (Acts 2:12). This question is still asked today.



Pentecost must be interpreted in light of Acts 1:4-8, where the risen Jesus, told the disciples to wait in Jerusalem for the promise of the Holy Spirit and they would receive power to be Christ's "witnesses ... even to the remotest part of the earth" (v. 8). Just as the ministry of Jesus depended on the Holy Spirit descending on Him at His baptism, so the ministry of the disciples depended on them receiving the Holy Spirit and relying on His power.

Today, the ministry of the church depends on the Holy Spirit. Pentecost therefore signals the fullness of the Spirit in God's people to empower them for witness to all the nations. Pentecost is about God equipping His church with the power of His Spirit so that He will be glorified among the nations. The Holy Spirit equips us for mission!

If we truly understand this great historic event, our hearts will embrace the Holy Spirit; our physical being will be empowered with gifts of the Spirit and we will be enflamed with a passion to proclaim Christ to the unsaved and the broken-hearted.
